Agnes A. Olbrys, 70, passed away peacefully at Baystate Medical Center on Tuesday, April 5, 2022. Born along with her twin sister, Helen (deceased), on January 1, 1952, daughters of the late Stanley and Sophie (Grzywoc) Olbrys, they were the first babies born at Springfield Hospital in the new year. A lifelong parishioner of St. Stanislaus Basilica, she attended St. Stanislaus School and was a graduate of Chicopee High School. She worked at Aetna Life Insurance Co. before becoming the bookkeeper and problem solver for the Basilica for almost 40 years. Agnes' life revolved around her church and the parish school, and she was always ready to take a phone call, answer a request, or provide a listening ear. She was a member of the Rosary and St. Vincent de Paul Societies, along with being a faithful Eucharistic Minister and Religious Education teacher.
