Charlie was a member of Laborers Union 999 and was employed for many years at Lane Construction, retiring in 1989. He is survived by his brother, Warren and his wife Suzanne of Springfield, his sisters, Viola and her husband Albert Bailey, III of East Longmeadow, and June Martell Darnley of Belchertown, and many loving nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his younger brother Edward Albrecht for whom he was a lifelong caregiver. He was also predeceased by another brother, George Albrecht, and stepfather, Oscar Bouchard.
