Kazimierz “Kaz” Giec, 68, passed away peacefully at home, surrounded by family, on Thursday, April 11, 2024. Born in Kielkow, Poland on September 25, 1955, son of the late Stanislaw and Kazimiera (Dybski) Giec, he served in the Polish Navy before immigrating to the United States with his family in 1998.
