



## Max W. Pienkos

August 21, 1924 - June 1, 2018

Max W. Pienkos, 93, passed away peacefully on Friday, June 1, 2018 at the Holyoke Soldiers Home, with his loving family by his side. Born August 21, 1924, son of the late Walter and Tekla (Stachowicz) Pienkos, he was a communicant of the Basilica of St. Stanislaus, Bishop & Martyr. A US Army Air Corps veteran of World War II, Max served in the European Theatre of War in Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes and Central Europe.
