



Max Paul Radwanski

May 6, 1920 - August 22, 2016

Max Paul Radwanski, 96, passed away in his sleep on Monday, August 22, 2016, at Woodrun Farm, Barre, MA, owned by his daughter Linda and son-in-law David Eiben. Born in Chicopee on May 6, 1920, son of the late Frank and Bertha (Musial) Radwanski, he lived for most of his life in Springfield. A US Army veteran of World War II, he served as a 1st Lieutenant with Company A 98th Signal Battalion. He fought in the battles of Luzon, the Philippines and New Guinea and was awarded the Asiatic Pacific Service Medal with Bronze Service Arrowhead and the Philippine Liberation Medal with Bronze Star. Max retired as a line and cable foreman after 34 years with the American Telephone and Telegraph Co. He loved being out-of-doors, especially as a fisherman; the family prizes photos of his huge striped bass trophies caught surf-casting on the Outer Cape. His daughters treasure memories of fishing with him in the Berkshires, at Quabbin, and on Cape Cod. He also really enjoyed cutting down and cutting up trees on Linda and Dave's wood lot. The day before he died, he was sawing up logs into useable pieces for the wood-burning furnace. Max was predeceased in 2010 by his beloved wife, Bertha (Bert) A. (Maziarz) Radwanski and is survived by his three loving daughters, Elaine R. Radwanski Ph.D and her husband Karl David, of Racine, WI, Linda R. Eiben DVM and her husband David, of Barre, MA and Betty Radwanski, of Arlington, MA; and his nieces and nephew, Donna, Joanne, Carol and Paul.
