Theodore E. Dygon, 80, passed away peacefully at home on Tuesday, August 9, 2016. Born in Chicopee on July 16, 1936, son of the late John and Wanda (Cebula) Dygon, he has lived in Palmer for many years. Theodore was a US Marine Corps veteran of the Korean War, and retired after many years of service as a machinist for Moore Drop Forge.
